

CAMH Redevelopment Update 2 month lookahead – May and June 2025:

Upcoming construction activities (May and June 2025)

- Things are moving up! We've reached the point in our construction where we're building upwards. In the coming months, you'll see the second floors of each building take shape. An exciting milestone!
- We will continue with forming, rebar, and concrete activities as we develop the structure of each building.
- We will continue placing subdivision utilities, including gas lines, hydro, cable, and telephone wires.
- We will continue excavation related to the underground mechanical and electrical installations and backfill activities.
- The heritage wall and historical shed refurbishment will be re-starting in May.

All redevelopment construction work will adhere to City of Toronto Bylaws, which permits operation of construction equipment **Monday to Friday from 7am to 7pm**, and **Saturdays from 9am to 7pm**. No noise-generating work will be completed on Sundays or statutory holidays.

Noise and Vibration

Noise and vibration monitors have been installed within and around the construction site to ensure we are working within bylaw requirements and are complying with the City.


Dust

Environmental controls are in place on the site that are in line with Ministry of Environment requirements and will be inspected formally weekly and informally on a daily basis to ensure compliance and minimize excessive dust.

Lights

In December 2024, we began redirecting the perimeter safety lighting to the project zone and turning off the tower crane lights at night. Our aim was to reduce lighting impact in response to community feedback. We will continue these practices moving forward. Thank you for your input; we appreciate your collaboration in finding a solution.

Completion



The Temerty Discovery Centre is expected to reach completion in late 2027. The Waverley House Secure Care & Recovery Building is expected to reach completion in mid-2029.

These buildings will transform the care and treatment we can provide for some of our most vulnerable patients and will further research and discoveries that will improve the lives of people living with mental illness. We know once completed, these two buildings will generate hope and transform mental health care and research at CAMH and beyond. The final site will also include additional public, open green spaces for the community to use.
